16.Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Since the university's establishment, we have pursued a cross-disciplinary approach. Now, with the implementation of NEP 2020, we are increasingly focused on strengthening interdisciplinary learning mechanisms at both the graduation and post-graduate levels. This technique will assist students in examining, synthesizing, and harmonizing connections between disciplines to create a coordinated and coherent whole. Students will be able to observe the same object through the eyes of other disciplines.

17.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The University successfully utilizes the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) system, which improves student mobility and flexibility. ABC IDs have been issued for 4695 students through 2023-24, allowing them to earn credits across a variety of learning pathways. This project promotes a student-centric approach by allowing for credit transfer, acknowledgment of prior learning, and tailored learning trajectories, thereby encouraging academic creativity and improving overall learning outcomes.

18.Skill development:

With the introduction of NEP 2020, the University has added a variety of skill enhancement courses to its course basket. The university exhibits its dedication to holistic student development by offering a varied range skill courses. In the year 2023-24 20 new skill oriented courses have been added to in the existing portfolio.

In addition to the structured courses the training & placement department provides specialized training to all the students as per their disciplines. This comprises workshops on stress management, cognitive behavioral therapy, food safety, and personality development, as well as industrial interface, technology training, and sports activities. The institution actively fosters literary abilities by offering creative writing programs and competitions. Law students profit from moot court sessions and legal field trips, whereas management students acquire practical experience through projects and assignments. Students in technical professions benefit from dedicated labs and technical excellence centers, which provide essential hands-on experience. The "Yuvaaz radio channel" gives mass communication students significant hands-on experience, helping them improve their communication, production, and presenting abilities.

The IQAC and a specialized committee have played a key role in advancing OBE implementation in several departments. The university has made great progress in bringing its teaching methods into line with OBE's objectives through a number of efforts, such as training sessions, seminars, curriculum revisions, and student awareness programmes. Assessment and Evaluation: • Midterm evaluations in line with OBE principles were put into place to monitor student progress. • Created a thorough OBE manual to serve as a guide for teachers and students. Student Awareness: • Conducted frequent workshops and awareness campaigns to acquaint students with OBE principles. • Promoted student participation in the evaluation process and feedback.

21.Distance education/online education:

In line with NEP 2020, the University promotes a digital-first learning environment. The university has a long history of computer education, and it uses a variety of online platforms for teaching and learning, including computer-based training, web-based training, and e-learning. The University provides a wide variety of online courses, including value-added programs, short-term certificate courses, and MOOCs via platforms such as NPTEL and SWAYAM. Furthermore, 32 New Age courses have been started via the AISECT Learn platform (University LMS). Faculty members actively participate in professional development through online seminars, workshops, and guest lectures organized by platforms like Zoom and Google Meet.

The University's accounts department records all types of receipts and payments also keeps record related to banking transactions and transactions related to creation of fixed assets on daily basis. The department closes its cashbook and daybook on daily basis. The transactions are checked and verified by AR (Accounts) and send it to CFAO for approval. An Internal Audit Team checks the validity and genuineness of the transactions. For this, the team collects ledger, cashbook, trail balance, bankbook, payment vouchers etc. After verification, the auditor generates a written report and forward it to registrar. The registrar and CFAO review the whole report and finalize as per the advice of the Internal Auditor and get the

transaction recorded accordingly. Finally, statements are forwarded to an external auditor. The External Auditor conduct the annual audit to verify the transactions. The objectives raised are settled by CFAO in consultation with the team. The audit team, CFAO, AR (Accounts) jointly draft the final report. The CFAO, Registrar and Board of Management jointly finalize the audit report and forward it to Finance Committee then the final report is forwarded to the GB for its Approval.
